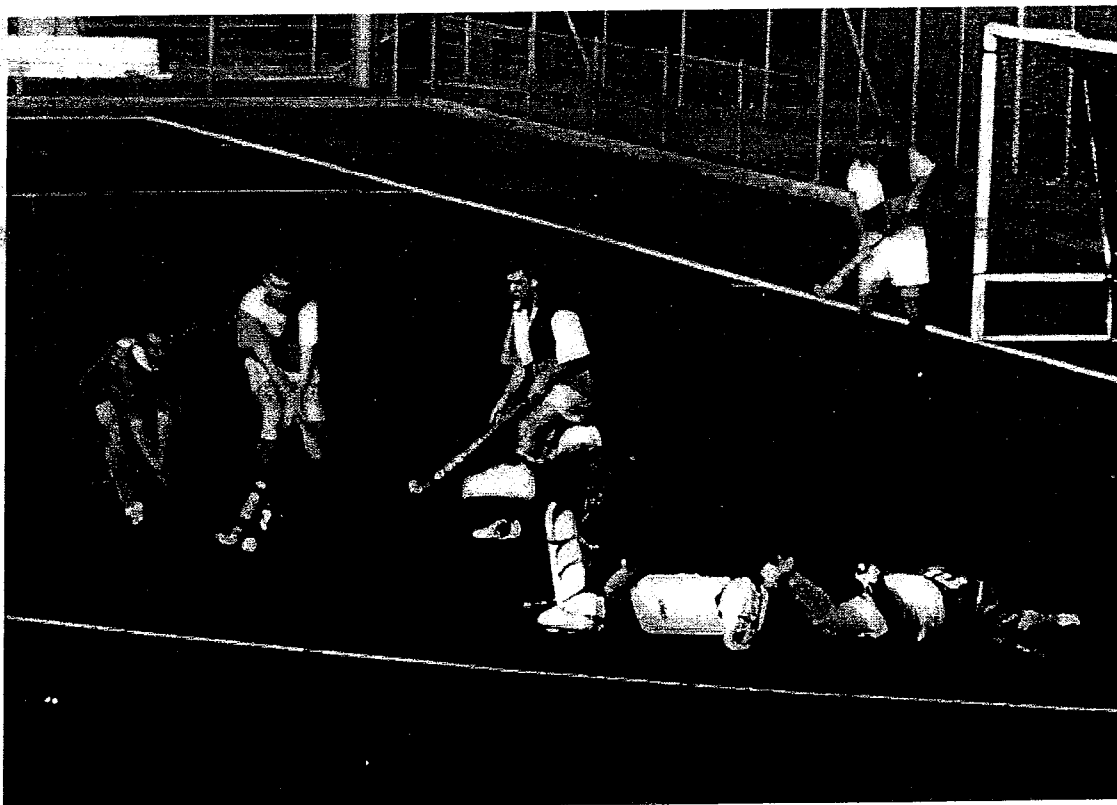

2ND GRADE REPORT
