President's Report 2001

We as a committee were initially concerned that the inclusion of the fourth team may have caused more problems than it solved, especially the effect on club culture with fourth team playing at different days, venues and times to other top three grades.

I am pleased to note that the inclusion of the fourth grade team has brought only positives to the club and the results suggest that we will definitely be a competitive team in Division 3.1 in 2002. Congratulations to Bruce Hood for scoring our first ever goal in a fourth grade team.

On the field the standout performance was without doubt our second grade team, which made it the preliminary final before being beaten by a classy first grade team imposing as second graders. Well done to everyone who played seconds throughout the year.

The remaining grades showed glimpses of classy hockey throughout the season but a lack of consistency and probably fitness resulted in very little September hockey for many in the club. We definitely have the ability to compete in all grades of Premier B and Div 3.1 and next year looks very promising indeed, especially if we ensure we continue our fitness work throughout the season.

Our dream of having our own water-based pitch at the Uni sports fields made a small but important step forward when we managed to convince our other friends in MUSA that a field should be the number two capital works priority after the swimming complex.

We are a long way from having a field but continued strong performances and increases in memberships will add further weight to our cause.

Most would argue our best performance this season was that of the side at our first Australian Uni Games and the journey we made to get there.

Further details about AUG's and ECG's follow, but my congratulations to everyone who competed at both Coffs Harbour and Homebush and special thanks to all those who came out and watched our games at Homebush.

I'm sure you are all looking forward to next season as much as I am, and hopefully we can continue to improve on the field and maintain the terrific club culture we have here at Macquarie, which is the envy of many clubs.

On behalf of the Committee, thanks to everyone for putting in such a great effort this season and we look forward to continuing the good work next season.

Secretary Report

Well it's the end of the season and time for me to reflect on the year that was.

For me the highlight of the season was the noticeable change in many players' attitudes towards the game and an increasing attitude of commitment to improvement in one's own personal game as well as a desire to increase the performance of each team.

Moreover, it was often opponents being sent off because of talking back to the referee as opposed to being the usual domain of Macquarie players.

Further, the start of the season saw many players committed to get to fit and when it came around to make field training.

Those who made it a regular occurrence were the ones who benefited the most. A big highlight was on one evening at training when we had some 40-plus players. Through training and commitment this club has the opportunity to produce teams which go on to finish the job of winning a grand final.

The team that I believe that was most rewarded for its commitment this year was third grade. Despite only finishing a less than rewarding 6^{th} place we beat teams which were higher on the ladder and when losses arose we only ever lost marginally.

However, it is ironic that the team that trained the hardest failed to impress this year and the team which trained the least made the finals (maybe there is something in it?).

It is always enjoyable to be a part of something which continues to grow and expand in numbers. This year the club grew exponentially and we hope to see these numbers remain. The introduction of the fourth grade side this year added another dimension.

It allowed players that had not played before the opportunity to craft their skills and those that had some to develop them. This grade started slowly and the beginning of the year but throughout the latter part of the year the grade began to gel and the results came.

Thanks especially to those members of thirds who backed up for two games a weekend especially when the games were a significant distance away from each other.

Next year we may see Macquarie University Sport Association (MUSA) deliver its long awaited field that the club has been campaigning for over a number of years. This field will allow us the opportunity to have two turf training sessions a week and give us the opportunity to train at times far more convenient.

Most importantly for next year MUSA has agreed to increase the funding for the club this will ensure that the club has the opportunity to look to expand training to an additional night and upgrade resources of the club.

- 5. To see up to 75% of members attending field training a week.
- 6. A coach for 2nds, 3rds and fourths.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The club's expansion to four teams and repairs needed on goalkeeping gear has seen our funds dry up as of the AGM. No seafood this year guys!

From a balance of \$2,230 at the start of the year the club was down to \$409 as at October 20.

However, we were due to receive another \$1,000 from our sponsor Eastwood Hotel and \$600 remaining from our annual MUSA grant.

The latter portion will be needed to pay the last instalment from SHA, and the former to purchase more shirts, shorts and socks for next season.

The main reason for the operating loss of \$1,835 over the ten and a half months was the committee's decision to help fund the team that went to ECG to the tune of \$1,300.

MUSA wants all representatives to stay together and that means 4-star resorts with expensive price tags. Rather than not attend, the club chose to help out financially. Our contribution was repaid in spades when the MAGUTS topped their pool at Coffs Harbour to thus qualify for AUG for the first time.

Their subsequent 5th placing at Homebush in September was an outstanding result and further enhanced our claims to a field at Uni (see below).

But with next year's tournaments to be at Newcastle (ECG) and Adelaide (AUG) it is clear our students will have to get off their backsides and start raising some serious money if they wish to compete.

I was very disappointed that some students chose NOT to go to either Games – their decisions beggar belief -- and not to bother attending the trivia night which helped raise \$300 for the cause.

Training one hour a week on a full field cost us \$3,000 this year but it is obvious we need more time on the turf to challenge the stronger clubs.

Thankfully we have been granted a substantial increase in funding by MUSA (\$8,500 annual plus \$2,500 special project). I anticipate much of the extra will go on turf training and coaching.

MUSA also granted us a one-off payment of \$2,000 to purchase a new set of goalie gear for 4ths and for substantial repairs late in the season to an older set.

We are getting a very good deal from MUSA at the moment and anything the MAGUTS can do to keep up a good impression with our governing body is appreciated.

At club level, it is also obvious we need a couple of people willing to take on the job of organising social functions. The prime purpose of these should be to raise funds and bolster our bottom line.

We have always been a friendly, social club but now that we turn over \$20,000 pa we must ensure we don't rely solely on MUSA and member's fees for subsistence. The cost of hockey has increased enormously in the last five years but there may be relief in sight.

A proposal for a water-based artificial pitch on the site of the current rugby league field has been approved at MUSA and University level but still faces several hurdles before fruition.

Across the board we need more people contributing to the running of the club, especially students, who get a great deal playing hockey for a University club. Thanks to my fellow committeemen for their efforts, and congratulations to 2nd grade on reaching the preliminary final.

First Grade 2001

Our first grade squad this year was strong and bolstered by our first true coach. It is disappointing then to reflect on our season. Certainly our defence continued the improvement evident in 2000. There has been significant improvement on the

-50 goal differences of the late 90's. However we were not strong enough to score the goals to play semi-finals.

Our efforts for the season peaked the weekend we played Saints and Gordon and took draws away from both. The intensity of our players in these 2 matches was markedly higher than in subsequent matches. All teams in Premier B, excepting Monterey, have improved their standard of play. We found that Randwick, Parramatta and Strikers were very hard to crack.

It was good to welcome Dave Henschell, Marcus, Dale, Tim and Radd to first grade. Dave Hegarty's return from Premier A 1st grade at Sydney Uni was most welcome, Timaaahy had a fantastic season in goals and was very unlucky not to pick up an award. Ian Thompson, Chris Jacka and Kal all turned in great games at times and it was just a pity that we couldn't put it together against the mid-ranked teams.

For the first time in our history we had a non-playing coach. Alan Thompson joined Macquarie and ran training and matches for our squad.

Alan identified major areas of potential improvement for our squad and worked hard to find some consistency in our play. Alan's attributes as a player include toughness and dedication and he held similar expectations for our 1st grade team.

After existing for 30 years without non-playing coaches our club psyche is a little brittle. It was obviously confronting for some players to be told that they needed to do a lot of work to be up to first grade standard.

Much of our energy this year was spent discussing different options, talking about being better etc. I think we would have been better performed if this energy had been directed to additional skills/fitness work. Our club expanded this year to four teams and to consolidate this growth it is essential to have a competitive first grade side.

I don't think enough players in our club understand that self-interest and club-interest are not always the same thing.

I hope all our players across the grades return next year and that we find the spirit so evident in our outrageously successful ECG/AUG representatives.

Every now and then Macquarie has a year when a team gels AND displays the mental tenacity required for success. This year 2nd grade had the magic formula - at least until the preliminary final.

After five rounds we were equal last with one win and a goal difference of 7-21.

Then, with some semblance of a stable side forming, we beat Randwick 3-1 in a rousing performance capped by fine goals to wingers Paul Notaras and Simon Plummer.

Things were falling into place and while unavailability still plays havoc with selections across the board, 2nd grade seemed to cope well.

Again we beat Randwick, 3-2, after storming to a 3-0 lead inside the first 20 minutes, then a third time, 4-1, in what I rated as the best performance by 2nd grade since I joined the club in 1983.

The addition of AJ and Adrian from 1st grade added toughness and class up the middle and helped us set new records for 2nd grade.

At one stage we won 5 in a row, a feat bettered only once in club history (the premiership year of 1994), including a crucial 3-1 win over South West Strikers.

This ultimately cost them 4th place and ensured we contested the semis.

Our 62 goals were the highest ever by 2nd grade and Joe Dean's 17 set a new individual mark for 2nds. (The previous best of 13 was in 1983 by a fitness freak named John Teplitski, who more recently directed Better Than Sex).

At 46, Joe continues to score goals very few people can and this was the seventh time he has bagged 10 or more in a season.

A contributing factor to our success was the greatly reduced amount of complaining about umpires or among ourselves. Several times we won because the opposition was ill-disciplined and we were strong. Gordon finished 7 points ahead of us in 3rd place and warmed up for the semi-final at Sutherland by playing catch with a tennis ball and doing some fancy exercises.

We knocked the ball around, practised a few corners and had a laugh; knowing we had nothing to lose against a side that had beaten us three times during the year.

What followed was a display of skill and grit to rival that Randwick match - as we prevailed 3-2 after extra time.

We should have won 2-1 in normal time but a ridiculous penalty stroke decision three minutes before fulltime gave Gordon a lifeline they didn't deserve.

Within 90 seconds of the restart AJ snuffed it out with his second cracking penalty corner goal of the match. We hung on, grimly defending our circle until the final whistle blew to our delight.

Unfortunately the drive and spirit evaporated during the next week and our effort in losing 6-1 to Monterey in the preliminary final was weak.

Slack marking, poor passing and a general lethargy gifted the match to a side we had comprehensively beaten only three weeks previously.

It also disappointed me that at the end of a season of greatly improved umpiring we should have one official completely out of their depth in each final.

St George was the only team we didn't beat and it remains a pity we didn't get one last crack at them in the grand final.

As it was, they comfortably beat Monterey 4-1 in the big one and deserved their triumph.

Geoff Horn has played many positions since joining Macquarie in the premiership year but found his niche at right half this year to easily win the players player award for 2nd grade.

Horny's impenetrable flat stick tackles, with his face often in the attacker's arse or groin, and his driving runs in attack meant he dominated that side of the field.

Another player I'd like to single out for a mention is Darren Cox.

This shy, wisp of a lad from WA blossomed in his second year at Macquarie and excelled at left inner, a difficult position.

Whenever we lost possession Darren would sprint back 5-15m and often beat an opponent who was much closer to the ball. This laid the platform for sustained attacks and allowed us to retain structure. Darren's best work is often done off the ball and consequently goes unnoticed or unappreciated. His improvement in all areas made him an automatic pick in a strong 2nd grade side.

Add to that his dedication to training and you have my reasons for giving him the coach's award for 2nd grade. Well done.

Thanks also to everyone who played 2nds at some stage, especially Bruce and Dave Diehm for filling in at short notice in the finals.

Next year presents a stiff challenge to do even better and I hope every 2nd grader has the desire to play a higher grade.
