OH WHAT A NIGHT – SPEWY'S SURPRISE DINNER

Over summer I started thinking of the most appropriate way to honour Mark 'Spewy' Gynther breaking Suresh Gulati's record of 402 games for the MAGUTS.

Mark finished the 2001 season on 399 games and barring an accident of tragic proportions was set to become the new standard bearer for the club early in the new season.

Much of the MAGUTS' tremendous club spirit was generated during the 1980s when we travelled in a dishevelled minibus to many carnivals each year and came back with raucous tales.

Mark attended almost every one of these (Albury, IV, SCANNED, Tamworth) and could always be relied upon to provide a few memorable comic moments on each occasion.

The nature of uni and work in general has changed the hockey landscape, making such road trips the exception rather than the rule – but no less fun as the ECG and AUG reports show.

I wanted Mark's big night to be a surprise dinner, and after a brief spot of mental telepathy with club legend Joe Dean thought a reunion of MAGUT elders would make for a terrific night.

And so it was, with 44 current members and 45 old boys present at North Sydney Anzac Memorial Club on Sat May 25 to give Mark the shock of his life.

Few current members would realise Mark almost died in a 1984 car accident that sadly claimed the life of his good mate Marty. Mark was told he would not play sport again and may not run.

Almost 20 years on he does struggle to run (only due to age) but can boast a CV of 417 games (111 in first grade), 19 goals, players' player awards in first grade (1989) and second grade (1983 and 1986) and a grand final appearance (1992).

He has served four years as club treasurer and if not for his garage what would we do for a clubhouse?

It was entirely fitting that third grade honour Mark by reaching the semis. I only hope he will one day taste premiership success.

Spewy, we love you.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Congratulations to everyone for contributing to one of the club's most successful years on the field.

Financially, we are also in a better position than last year, having added about \$1,000 to our bottom line.

This was achieved despite the added cost of training twice a week for the first time in our history.

I envisage next year we will train full field on both nights and trust members will support this proposal at the AGM, while remaining aware it may add \$30 to their annual fees.

Membership rose to a club record 59 players across four teams and income from member's fees hit a record \$12,400.

The increase in playing numbers was mainly through elected members and as such the amount we returned to MUSA in fees was also a record \$5,400.

Given that we also pay \$2,500 as part of a dollar-for-dollar special project fund, it means we are giving back to MUSA almost \$8,000 of the \$11,000 we receive in annual funding.

I have negotiated a \$1,000 increase in our budget allocation, taking our annual grants to \$12,000 – making us the fourth best supported club under the MUSA umbrella.

We are getting an excellent deal and I ask members to be mindful of that, especially while we await construction of our artificial field. The cost of fielding four teams in the SHA has risen to \$11,600 pre-GST and thankfully MUSA pays the GST on all bills.

A special thank you must go to Lenny for a wonderful social calendar, the highlight being the surprise reunion dinner to honour Mark Gynther breaking Suresh Gulati's club record of 402 games. I must also note that most social functions contributed little to our financial affairs and this situation must be rectified next year if we are to fund our expansion without taxing members as a first option. The trivia night was a particular disappointment, with only 20 members present.

Congratulations to 1st and 3rd grades on reaching the semis, and to the ECG and AUG sides for their encouraging performances.

On a final note, it would be nice to see more students active in running the club and I thank Chris and Kyle for their efforts over the last two years.

I hereby present the accounts for calendar year 2001 and for the period 1.1.02 to 26.10.02, and welcome any questions that members may raise. Let's do even better in 2003.

Macquarie University Hockey Club - 1st Grade Report

1st grade had a good season, finishing in the preliminary final. The 2-1 defeat was very frustrating with two goals disallowed by a young, inexperienced umpire. We felt they were goals and on the day we were clearly the better side with better field position, more short corners etc. During the season we played probably the best and most consistent hockey played by a Macquarie University first grade side ever. There was considerable improvement in the skill level and depth in the first grade squad.

The decision to train 2 nights per week definitely lifted the skill level. I have been advocating for several years that we needed to train more than one night per week and the improvement during the year obviously confirmed the advancement in skills by all the players. Thanks go to Dave Hegarty and Kal Gulson for their input during the year both at training and at matches. Players were supportive of the extra training with most attending both sessions when possible.

Tim Austin had an excellent year, and we are fortunate in having an excellent group of goalkeepers; congratulations to Phil Petersen for reaching 100 1st grade games. Ian Thompson and Chris Jacka were two of the best defenders in the competition and with good skills on the ball gave us the ability to positively change the depth and angle of play. Kim Langfelder and Dave Henschell were both very strong at centre half, with both having the ability to play any defensive position. Kal Gulson linked positively and creatively at right half and scored his usual quota of short corner deflection goals. Ralph Scott was as creative and thoughtful as usual and was runner up in the SHA best and fairest. Ralph is always a positive contributor and a good hockey thinker.

Ben Odgers played inside left with a high work rate and could be creative and dangerous. Tom Cameron is a very quick striker (especially if he had a quiet Friday night) with a good shot on goal, and was a good acquisition for the club.

Paul Notaras came into first grade during the season and helped maintain the balance of skills and control in our forward line. Dave Hegarty is, as we all know, very skilled and explosive on the ball and seemed to enjoy the role of striker, which he filled for the latter part of the season. Chris Gilchrist played strongly in a variety of positions while Alistair showed his tremendous potential, playing most of the season in 1st grade.

Pete Jacka was a dangerous striker early on in the season but was unfortunately injured for the second half of the season. Mathew Floyd, Paul Hebblewhite and Allan Leigh made constructive contributions to 1st grade at different stages throughout the year.

Macquarie University Hockey Club - 2nd Grade Report

Considering the fact that the only times 2nd grade were outplayed this season were when the other side was heavily stacked with 1st graders, you can be forgiven for being confused at why 2nd grade did not make the finals this year. It was a very unfortunate result for 2nd grade, considering the promising play through most of the season. In the end, there being 5 quality clubs this year allowed the club that missed out on the 1st grade finals to stack their 2nd grade side and make the finals there. Add to that several 1-goal losses or draws in games we easily could have won at the start of the season, and the loss of a few key players towards the end of the season, and unfortunately we just missed out a semi final spot.

Starting from the goalie, Phil Petersen again proved his worth with a solid season. It is a blessing for the club to have three keepers all capable of playing 1st grade. Marcus Reed at back surprised plenty of opposition with his huge reaching tackles. Ian Jessup unfortunately had the flu 90% of the season. Just how good would he be if fully fit? Mark Gauci found that fullback is the best place to put his extensive communication skills to good use. Paul Hebblewhite had a great season in the halves, proving that big nights out are obviously a great preparation for hockey. Although some would argue that Adrian Carruthers is proof that big nights out are not good preparation for hockey, he once again showed us his value as a hard running forward.

Dale Aitken was the backbone of the side at centre half, showing all the skills and know how required to be a quality hockey player. Darren Cox at left inner was our most consistent player, playing almost all the games and going to most of the trainings. Every week his effort and concentration was high. He is improving every year, and I am looking forward to seeing more improvement next year. Joe Dean once again showed his uncanny knack of scoring goals at centre forward, a second grade record of 18. He was sorely missed at the tail end of the season when injured. Paul Notaras (17 goals) was unfortunately playing too well on the wing and had to be moved to first grade because no one was meant to be allowed to score as many goals as Joe does each season. Our season total of 82 was also a club record for second grade.

Bruce Hood played the best hockey I have ever seen him play early in the season. Hopefully he will continue to improve through hard training again at the start of next season. Geoff Horn was skilful on the ball from the half line, and successfully proved his theorem "I play better after a beer or two". Mathew Floyd and Alistair Gilchrist both showed great potential as skilful young forwards. They may not play too much more 2nd grade as they continue to improve. Alan Leigh was a very useful forward at the start of the season and it was a shame he had to go back to Melbourne. Brendan Jacka played a bit towards the end of the season, showing that he is capable of playing in 2nd grade, and is definitely on the improve.

All in all it was a good season for 2nd grade. The end result didn't match what the team deserved. Everyone should come back next season, hungry to show that to be true.

3rd Grade Report – 2002

2002 was a very solid year for the Maguts third grade squad, with a spot in the semi-finals hopefully being a stepping stone for further success in 2003.

The year began with Mark 'Spewy' Gynther further cementing his place in the annals of Maguts history by playing his 400th, and later his record-breaking 403rd games. The 4-1 win over St George in his 400th made the celebrations much merrier for all concerned.

Our defensive record (29 goals against) was the best in the competition and can largely be attributed to some excellent man-to-man marking; and some phenomenal work from each one of our goalkeepers, regularly Marcus Fung(soulbrother).

Spewy, Kevin (Backstick) Marshall and Alan ("I'm an old fella now but back when I was younger...") Thompson were always reliable at the back; and with consistent support from Chris (Mr Bean) Boden and Dave (Deadweight) Holmes in the halves, these guys and anyone else who had a run in the back half can take a lot of pride in our defence.

Our midfield was an example of the versatility of this year's 3rd grade squad, with work commitments, injuries etc leading to a new combination virtually every week. When present, uninjured and not too pissed from the night before, some often devastating displays of skill in combination with a general lack of match fitness were shown by Marcin (my ribs hurt) Firek, Dave (sorry again Ben, but I have to work) Gifford, Alex (Funky Gibbon / Trippy) Gibson and Brenda Jacka.

Craig (Sniper) Williams also possessed the desire to be a goalie killer, but whenever he'd get a sniff I'd push him back to the halves.

Every now and then we'd let 'Oby (Rednuts) Grattan-Wilson pick up his scythe and one-handedly take on the poor opposition's backs, or inners, or halves, or forwards, or goalie, or pretty much anyone within the vicinity of the field. Sometimes he'd win, sometimes they'd win, quite often the umpires would win; but at the end of the day I think 3rd grade were the winners when in round 11 Rednuts decided to come back from the wilderness.

Many celebrity cameos were made during the season for 3rd grade. Bruce (Cueball) Hood was regularly asked to play, then told 10 mins later he wouldn't be needed. Adrian (Aids) Carruthers showed some lightning speed up front, then in the backs, then up front again; and Ian (Tootsie) Jessup enlightened us to the benefits of overheads from the back.
