

1st Grade Report

After the dizzy heights of 2002, 2003 was a disappointing season. Despite the relegation of UNSW, we started with high hopes for the season, even aiming for a top two finish after the first round. Our eventual sixth-placed finish probably reflected our overall endeavour, though there were some glimpses of good play that bode well for the future.

In hindsight there were probably two key factors that worked against us this year. One, the idea of a coaching panel made up of Alan Thompson, and 1st graders Ralph Scott, Chris Jacka and Kal Gulson did not operate at all well. Too many captains of the ship so to speak, and this had deleterious effects on the coaches' own playing performances, and led to inconsistency in team approaches and application. It is obvious, and I have been of course told this a number of times now, that what First Grade needs is one designated off-field coach. This will happen in 2004.

Related to coaching is the idea of sourcing outside ideas. Due to the lack of recent Premier A experience within the club, we started out the year wanting to try and incorporate some new ideas through the sourcing of expert advice from such people as Larry McIntosh and Adam Commens. Unfortunately, this was done in a disorganised manner and resulted in little being achieved. Despite the failure of the coaching panel I do think that trying to build the coaching resources within the club is the best direction, using outside advice to supplement club knowledge and bring in new ideas.

The second factor that worked against us is related to the coaching disarray and that is that our performances on the training paddock lacked intensity. We failed to master many basic skills that led to success in the previous season. An approach that incorporates a well-planned skills program can allow us to attempt to play an attractive and effective style of hockey.

On a positive note, we did see some exciting play, and some, at times, successful introduction of different systems of play. We also saw the welcome return of the wandering minstrel Baldrick, the ascendance of the Bitch, Hebba and briefly Dunny, and the arrival of introduction of Jimmy 'How pretty am I?' Birkefeld. A club legend Ralph Scott also came tantalising close to 300 1st grade games, finishing the season on 299.

I would like to thank all players for their efforts this year, and in particular, those players that unselfishly moved between 1st and 2nd grade through the year. The Brothers Gilchrist, Nasty, and Dunny (apologies to those I forgot) showed a desire to play the top grade; an attitude we can hopefully continue to cultivate. Lastly, we say goodbye to a few players. Klimmy who has gone to create havoc in Bristol, Heggs who will be moving back to the big league, and Dave Henschell who is off to Europe if he can read his flight details accurately.

Congratulations to Klimmy for racking up 15 quality goals in a side that missed the finals and to Chris Jacka who tied for 8th in the count for the Premier B medal.

With increased backing of MUSA it is on to season 2004 – the year of the MAGUT.

For the second year running we missed the semi-finals by two points, and again we struggled against the teams above us on the ladder.

The first four rounds really hurt – two draws and two losses when we should have had three wins and a loss – and we were chasing the pack from then on.

To our credit we roared home in the second half thanks to a new structure initiated by Tim Dunn and had rousing last minute wins over Moorebank, Glebe and St George – all the sweeter as they had dropped two of their gun 1st graders. Yes – the season was like a round of golf where you have lots of birdies and double bogeys: you don't know whether you deserved better or not, whether to highlight the good moments or the bad.

I was at a loss to explain our pathetic efforts against Randwick, who weren't that good, but ecstatic at our second half rallies to down Ryde, Sutherland, Moorebank, Glebe and St George.

Coaching second grade is a unique challenge – there is little time to prepare the team mentally when you are playing an adjoining grade and perhaps this explained some poor starts to games.

Our draws with Sutho and Easts early in the season should have been comfortable wins and we clearly need to develop that killer instinct in the circle if we are to threaten in September.

Unavailability will always be a factor at such an amateur level and it hurt that such gifted attacking players such as Tom Cameron (7 games), Paul Notaras (5 games) and Ben Haynes (9 games) could not figure more regularly in 2nds.

We were definitely a different side when they were on the paddock.

Special moments in 2nds this year include: Alistair's diving reverse stick mid-air save in the last minute at a rain-soaked Sutherland in round two to earn a point, Dale scoring the first five goals against Glebe at Concord, our 20-minute burst at Homebush against Ryde when we sizzled, Dale's winner after the siren against a very shirty Moorebank, Tom's winner in the last minute against Glebe, Marcus Fung saving a penalty stroke against St George and Ben's slow motion scoop over the keeper to win it 4-3 – hair-raising, beer-sniffing stuff indeed!

After each game I sat down and awarded points on a 3-2-1 basis. This proved a difficult exercise some weeks and I found that at season's end every regular second grader had scored points – with a logiam at the top.

Chris Gilchrist was a clear winner of the players' player award and it was a privilege to watch this tackling machine in operation when we were under the pump.

I gave my coach's award to Gibbo for his tireless efforts at inner and left half but would like to single out Adrian Carruthers for his high workrate and motivation.

I have often been a critic of aspects of Adrian's game but he took it upon himself to be the on-field leader when we really needed a strong voice and someone to lead by example.

TREASURER'S REPORT

This year should deliver a strong performance on the financial front, due to an increase in MUSA funding and a small rise in members' fees.

We should raise our bank balance from \$1,600 to about \$4,500.

The rise in fees was meant to cover the extra cost of training two nights, full field – something that didn't eventuate due to a lack of time at Ryde and the absence of our own field.

Hopefully we can find a way to expand training times but this will cost an extra \$2,000.

Our coffers were boosted by not needing to purchase shirts this year but we'll need to buy new ones over the summer as we ponder a change in playing strip and a likely merger with the women's club.

Repairs to goalkeeping gear were substantial but an unavoidable outlay.

Our major expense: It now costs about \$12,000pa to field our 4 teams in SHA. Total admin costs amount to \$90 per player.

This year we collected nearly \$14,000 in members' fees and received \$12,000 from MUSA but also handed back almost \$8,000 to MUSA in fees and special project funding.

One aspect of the club operations that needs drastic attention is the fact that our hugely popular and memorable social functions deliver little capital back to the club.

MUSA has substantially changed the way clubs will request and handle annual funding allocations but this will also allow us to cement the coaching funding program that took its first few tentative steps this year.

Finally, are there any students who fancy a spell on committee? For about an hour a week you can contribute to the running of the club.

Thanks to all members and their partners / friends for helping make 2003 a successful financial year for the MAGUTS, to my fellow coaches for a committed effort and to my family for putting up with me spending so much time on hockey.
