1st Grade Report

After the dizzy heights of 2002, 2003 was a disappointing season. Despite the relegation of UNSW, we started with high hopes for the season, even aiming for a top two finish after the first round. Our eventual sixth-placed finish probably reflected our overall endeavour, though there were some glimpses of good play that bode well for the future.

In hindsight there were probably two key factors that worked against us this year. One, the idea of a coaching panel made up of Alan Thompson, and 1st graders Ralph Scott, Chris Jacka and Kal Gulson did not operate at all well. Too many captains of the ship so to speak, and this had deleterious effects on the coaches' own playing performances, and led to inconsistency in team approaches and application. It is obvious, and I have been of course told this a number of times now, that what First Grade needs is one designated off-field coach. This will happen in 2004.

Related to coaching is the idea of sourcing outside ideas. Due to the lack of recent Premier A experience within the club, we started out the year wanting to try and incorporate some new ideas through the sourcing of expert advice from such people as Larry McIntosh and Adam Commens. Unfortunately, this was done in a disorganised manner and resulted in little being achieved. Despite the failure of the coaching panel I do think that trying to build the coaching resources within the club is the best direction, using outside advice to supplement club knowledge and bring in new ideas.

The second factor that worked against us is related to the coaching disarray and that is that our performances on the training paddock lacked intensity. We failed to master many basic skills that led to success in the previous season. An approach that incorporates a well-planned skills program can allow us to attempt to play an attractive and effective style of hockey.

On a positive note, we did see some exciting play, and some, at times, successful introduction of different systems of play. We also saw the welcome return of the wandering minstrel Baldrick, the ascendance of the Bitch, Hebba and briefly Dunny, and the arrival of introduction of Jimmy 'How pretty am I?' Birkefeld. A club legend Ralph Scott also came tantalising close to 300 1st grade games, finishing the season on 299.

I would like to thank all players for their efforts this year, and in particular, those players that unselfishly moved between 1st and 2nd grade through the year. The Brothers Gilchrist, Nasty, and Dunny (apologies to those I forgot) showed a desire to play the top grade; an attitude we can hopefully continue to cultivate. Lastly, we say goodbye to a few players. Klimmy who has gone to create havoc in Bristol, Heggs who will be moving back to the big league, and Dave Henschell who is off to Europe if he can read his flight details accurately.

Congratulations to Klimmy for racking up 15 quality goals in a side that missed the finals and to Chris Jacka who tied for 8th in the count for the Premier B medal.

TREASURER'S REPORT

This year should deliver a strong performance on the financial front, due to an increase in MUSA funding and a small rise in members' fees.

We should raise our bank balance from \$1,600 to about \$4,500.

The rise in fees was meant to cover the extra cost of training two nights, full field – something that didn't eventuate due to a lack of time at Ryde and the absence of our own field.

Hopefully we can find a way to expand training times but this will cost an extra \$2,000.

Our coffers were boosted by not needing to purchase shirts this year but we'll need to buy new ones over the summer as we ponder a change in playing strip and a likely merger with the women's club.

Repairs to goalkeeping gear were substantial but an unavoidable outlay.

Our major expense: It now costs about \$12,000pa to field our 4 teams in SHA. Total admin costs amount to \$90 per player.

This year we collected nearly \$14,000 in members' fees and received \$12,000 from MUSA but also handed back almost \$8,000 to MUSA in fees and special project funding.

One aspect of the club operations that needs drastic attention is the fact that our hugely popular and memorable social functions deliver little capital back to the club.

MUSA has substantially changed the way clubs will request and handle annual funding allocations but this will also allow us to cement the coaching funding program that took its first few tentative steps this year.

Finally, are there any students who fancy a spell on committee? For about an hour a week you can contribute to the running of the club.

Thanks to all members and their partners / friends for helping make 2003 a successful financial year for the MAGUTS, to my fellow coaches for a committed effort and to my family for putting up with me spending so much time on hockey.
