President's Report 2004

What a year the club has had with four out of the five teams making the SHA finals. We increased our playing list substantially to a record 77 members, allowing us to enter a fifth side in 3.2, which in turn forced our fourth grade team to go back up a grade (returning to 3.1).

The club introduced many new policies and with the coaching grant approved by MUSA gave us the opportunity to bring in new coaches with fresh ideas.

2004 again started with the traditional pre-season training in and around The Middle of Nowhere fields. The fitness levels of each player concerned grew due to this training and with the pre-season trials. Drawing to the end of the season the club started to focus on the finals.

The last round match determined if our first grade side would make a clean sweep of all 5 grades in the finals. Unfortunately they just fell short.

We fielded five teams in the SHA, with all teams providing highlights throughout the season. Seconds would consider themselves unlucky after drawing their semi-final against Ryde and then watching Ryde destroy ASSG dreams of winning the grand final. Third grade were so close and with 2 minutes left in the grand final they may have thought they had won the one thing that had eluded them for quite awhile. But two very good late goals by ASSG spoiled the moment. Fourth grade, last year's glamour team, rose to a new level and in turn played a higher grade. They too suffered the same fate as third grade as they were beaten in extra time by a freak goal. Fifth grade turned out to be the surprise packet of the club.

With little experience but a strong commitment to each other and some intensive early season skills work they created a little piece of history by playing in the finals in their first year in the competition. First grade were unfortunate as they played with determination and grit in the first half of the year only to fall short when it counted. Again our main goal for next year is to recruit new players so the growth of our club continues and with that we can enter a team possibly in second division (2.3). In 2001 fourth grade made their appearance, 2004 fifth grade made their appearance and hopefully in 2005 sixth grade will make their entry into the SHA competition.

Congratulations must go to all coaches this season. Their enthusiasm and commitment advanced our club to another level.

First grade coach Ralph may have considered his first year as coach unlucky because the depth and talent in the team was incredible but unfortunately the opposing teams had recruited well and did not allow our team to play at their full potential.

Dave Holmes who in his second year as a coach did extremely well taking his side, second grade, into the finals.

Also one cannot go past the efforts of our third grade coach Ian (Toots) Jessup who produced a side worthy of winning a premiership.

Fourth grade, well, what can I say, two grand finals in two years, thanks guys. Fifth grade coach Lenny was put into the position of coach and excelled. Under his guidance fifth grade played in the finals in their first year.

The committee has performed miraculously, with special mention to the tireless amount of work completed by our treasurer lan (Toots) Jessup who juggled his appointment with his coaching responsibilities. The social side of the club was again held up by Lenny's vigorous work to keep the Maguts and Maggettes drunk. Also thanks go to Gibbo (secretary) Tim Dunn (club captain) and Jussi for looking after the website.

Remember gentlemen there will be vacancies on the committee for next year so don't be afraid to volunteer.

Lastly we can hold our heads high because the club has continued to advance their status as a professional one. Many of the Premier clubs have kept an eye on us as we have increased our numbers and with the new field being approved will gain the opportunity to increase our playing list. The club also needs to develop a program where we entice juniors to come to the club. I mean Joe Dean only has two boys and Josh and Kemba wont be able to play quite a while so we need junior depth in our club.

As we draw to a conclusion of yet another year we can sit back and wonder what if we did this or that during moments of the game. Some players would consider that they and their team had a great year where others will be left wondering what happened to our team after the progress we made during the 2004 season. Personally I consider that we had a year of improvement and next year we can increase that level yet again. 2005 will be the year of the Magut.

Thanks Maguts for a season I will not forget.

I will look forward to the 2005 season with vitality and high expectations.

TREASURER'S REPORT

An influx of more than 25 new members, many of them Uni students, has brought tremendous on-field success and an enormous challenge for the committee.

Adding a fifth team cost us an extra \$4,500 in SHA Fees - money we had not budgeted for.

At the time of the AGM we were financially in a deep hole (down \$5,500 for the year and in debt by \$1,000) but some late MUSA top-up funding and sponsorship money from Epping Hotel should ensure we finish 2004 maybe a little worse off but overall not too bad.

I have already registered our disappointment with the new powers at MUSA regarding our uniforms and the rather expensive price tag that accompanied them.

I had budgeted for \$80 per kit (2 shirts, shorts, socks) to be funded 50-50 with MUSA but the final cost was about \$105 pre-GST. This further hit our bottom line.

Thankfully we were able to increase our turf training time at Ryde but again this meant another \$2,800.

What all the above means is that to put 5 teams on the paddock, fully clothed, and train twice a week costs \$411 per player before GST.

Our fees are the lowest in Sydney hockey but I anticipate an increase is needed to boost our coffers. I apologise for the cheap fees and uniforms affecting our bottom line.

What is painfully clear, and has been pointed out to MUSA, is that without our own field, a canteen and a venue for post-game functions we have little capacity to raise funds outside member fees and MUSA. As part of MUSA's new funding arrangement clubs will be rewarded for having a high student percentage and for the amount of money they raise – but not by lifting fees exorbitantly.

We desperately need some dedicated club members to work out how to raise over \$3,000 next year without having to dip into members' pockets for the lot.

People recoil in horror at selling chocolates or raffle tickets but they bring in money from outside.

From 2005 the head coach position will be jointly funded with MUSA, reinforcing the need to have an independent source of funds.

We have an excellent working relationship with MUSA and I believe the club is heading in the right direction but we need more helpers.

I anticipate this being my last year as treasurer and hope to see more students on committee

Lastly, I thank the coaches for their long hours and my fellow committee members for their work. Congratulations to the award winners and major milestone MAGUTS Spewy (450 games), Joe (400 games), Ralph (300 first grade games) and Kal (200 first grade games).

These four define what it means to be a MAGUT.

Best wishes to those players leaving us next year and a safe Christmas to those returning in 2005.

1st GRADE COACH'S REPORT 2004 by Ralph Scott

The pre-season was exciting as we welcomed several players of 1st grade calibre. After losing more than half the 2003 side this was a much-needed injection of talent. Nine sides contested SHA 1st grade and each of them played with vigour. The season began with two heavy losses to SWS & Saints, in which we conceded 12 goals & scored 1.By the 3rd match were at full strength and began a sequence of 8 matches in which we played every side in the competition.

In this stretch we had 5 wins, a draw & 2 defeats. This "half-season" performance indicated to me that we had the skill & endeavour to challenge in the finals. During this period Tex gave a virtuoso performance against Ryde when he alone denied groups of 2 & 3 Ryde strikers on 4 occasions. Jimmy played a cunning game at centre forward & enabled us to convert Tex's brilliance by creating our 2 goals. We had a lot of fun demolishing Moorebank 8-1 & Shaggy's unadulterated passion upon scoring goals lives with me.

The best performance of the year was the 3-2 defeat of Minor Premiers Randwick. Dunny was courageous in the last line & Kal scythed through the best defence in the competition repeatedly, including a great assist to give Ryno the match-winner, after Marcus Reed had hammered us back into the game & Jakka gave us another. Ben Haynes came into the squad at this time & performed solidly. Also at this time Dean Crossingham, fresh from a four-year rest, ran into some fine form. He finished off Bankstown with a well-placed low drag flick from a short corner late in the match. The 2-2 draw with Saints (now PA1) at the airport was another strong performance with Baldrick (as he did so often) & Jake reading & shutting down the Saints classy attack.

Tom Cameron also scored a couple of excellent goals and later showed some class at right half. So at the halfway mark we were placed $3^{\rm rd}$ on the ladder and seemed to be developing a robust defence. In the second half of the season our will and our performance faltered. We were still in contention for a finals berth as we entered the last match of the season but were unable to overturn a narrow $1^{\rm st}$ round loss to Easts. Consequently we finished a very disappointing $6^{\rm th}$ on the ladder.

Two factors prevented us from capitalising on our mid season form.

- Relatively low attendance rates at training. As the Coach I was disappointed that I
 was unable to motivate stronger attendances at training.
- Our lack of belief in each other. During the 8 match sequence highlighted above most players in the team queried the value of someone else in the team. This was in a period when we lost 1 match and were the second best performed side in the competition, so I was surprised by the feelings being expressed. I believe having played with so many of the playing group hindered our group accepting my message that our squad had achieved much in April, May & June & was the best we had to run with. Consequently we had little group belief over the last 4 matches of the season.

So it was great to launch ourselves into contention & disappointing to fade away. Consistency is the key to more regular success. I have outlined my thoughts to our executive on how to achieve this & look forward to a stronger Club next season.

Second Grade Report

3RD GRADE REPORT by Ian Jessup

This year's grand final loss is going to hurt for a long time.

We dominated St George, a team that totally outplayed us in both rounds and the semi-final, and led 1-0 with two minutes to play.

Physically, tactically, individually, mentally: we were stronger.

Alas there was a crucial turnover, a penalty corner, a goalmouth scrap, the equaliser.

In extra time we copped some atrocious decisions and Saints found the winner. We had a corner after the siren but could not convert. Sad, but proud.

That we performed so admirably was no doubt due to the confidence gained from defending doggedly in the semi and then giving a fast, young, skilled SW Strikers side a lesson in the preliminary final – even if we needed extra time.

According to my records, this was the first time in 30 years our third grade had won a finals match.

Despite also entering the finals in second place for the first time in 30 years I wondered if we had what it takes to beat St George. They had twice thrashed us 5-1, we split our games with Strikers and the rest were not much. So for 90% of the season we were in second gear.

The semi-final, where we lost 2-1 to St George and led 1-0 with eight minutes to go, showed we could switch on and step up – but we were still outplayed. This was the first time all year I saw all 14 players really focussed – and they could see it in each other's eyes which was very important.

Against Strikers we lifted the intensity another couple of notches while remaining calm in our execution. It was superb, uncompromising play.

Here's what Saints said on their website about the grand final: "Down 1-0 for most of the game and being outplayed by a determined and focused Uni team..."

You don't want to read the rest. We know how it ends.

Thirds benefited from having some old hard heads from the 1994 premiership in Phil, Marcin, Greg, Ralph, Joe and for the grand final Marinco.

Joe scored a 3rd grade record 21 goals, Ralph bagged 15 and Joe's son Jack became the youngest MAGUT to score 10 goals in a season and earn a place on the club records page - at age 15. Jack was also a standout winner of the club's Most Improved Award.

Simon Plummer and Chris Seletto relished the extra time and space after being dropped from seconds to keep the goals coming. Simon's effort to score in all three finals matches was outstanding.

Jim, Willem, Marcin and Bruce across the halves shut out opposing forwards while the fullbacks in Greg and Mark G x 2 pulled off a truckload of great tackles.
