#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2005 was a very trying year after the success of 2004 when we had a record 76 players in five teams, with four making the semis and two the grand finals.

This year we were back to four teams, 62 members and only third grade in the semis. They lost to Ryde 3-1 and were eliminated in the first week.

The apathy shown in poor training attendances in the winter months was reflected in our results: 2<sup>nd</sup> grade were unbeaten after four rounds yet faded to finish sixth. In the Premier B club championship we were second last, our worst result for some time.

I would like to thank our coaches Marcus Reed, Tom Pacey, Lenny Furtado, Jimmy Birkefeld and Toby Gratton-Wilson for their work this year.

Coaching is a thankless task and few members would realise how much time is spent preparing a team for training and games. A kind word in person to your coach will make them feel greatly appreciated.

On a personal note the club had a baby boom in 2005 with Marcin Firek and Phil Petersen becoming fathers for the first time, and Mark Gauci and Wayne O'Brien for the second time. Congratulations and best wishes as your families grow.

Last summer Dale Aitken and Simon Plummer married their loves.

Alex Gibson not only celebrated a half-blue for ECG all-star selection but recently announced his engagement at the end of a year in which he was a regular first grader.

While there was little to shout about from a team or club perspective, many members could look back proudly on some individual hockey achievements.

Our first grade keeper Andrew 'Tex' Liang finished second in the count for the PB1 Medal and James Birkefeld fifth. It was a disgrace that long-serving SHA president Kevin Flack, after whom the medal is named, denigrated our club during the medal count by inferring our two representatives were wasting their time at Macquarie.

Ralph Scott and Ian Jessup each reached the 400-game milestone and thoroughly enjoyed themselves playing for ACT at the Australian Over-40 championships in Wollongong in October. Overlooked by the NSW selectors, Ian and Ralph were each twice voted best player by their opponents.

This season Ian (211) became the second MAGUT after Joe Dean to score 200 goals for the club while Ralph took his tally to 141, third on the alltime list. Well done.

Congratulations to Players' Player winners Pete Jacka, Matt Floyd, Willem Koopman and Ben Wellfare. They are quiet guys who let their hockey do the talking and an example to the rest of us.

Likewise for first year player Tone Seale who won the Most Improved Award, and all those people who reached 50-game multiple milestones.

Lenny made his first entry into the record books with 11 goals for the season in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade while Ian cracked the ten-goal barrier for the eighth time in leading 2<sup>nd</sup> grade.

A big thank you goes to those guys who played two games on a weekend. It happened a lot this year which also told in our results.

We also welcomed our youngest ever member, 14-year-old James Dean – son of Joe and Judy and brother of Jack. This family has served Macquarie magnificently for almost 30 years.

Looking outwards, the club is at a crossroads.

SHA plans to restructure the competition next year and we may be tantalisingly close to finally getting our own turf – in partnership with UTS most likely.

These two changes present serious challenges for the committee and all members.

A mountain of work needs to be done before the field is built to ensure we can benefit financially and strategically. I urge everyone to attend the planning day that MUSR is hosting.

The reluctance of people to step forward and take leading roles at the MAGUTS leaves 95% of the work to a couple of dedicated guys.

This cannot promote efficiency or build success. Many hands make light work.

Have a serious think about what managerial / entrepreneurial / professional skills you possess and whether you could spare one hour a week to give them to the club.

A special thank you goes to club captain Chris Jacka who repeatedly stepped up to ballboy, umpire or generally help out at times when others who were rostered on couldn't be bothered – especially first graders.

Chris' efforts to get the adventure race up and running as an annual fundraiser were huge. If we are to survive financially we need to draw funds from the community at large and the fun run is an ideal vehicle.

I do not see any future for myself on the club executive due to work and family commitments and after 13 years across the three major positions I'm quite frankly fed up with the general apathy of most members.

We need a strong, visionary student presence on the executive (and committee) to further strengthen ties with MUSR.

The threat of the VSU from a vindictive government blinkered by 1950s right wing ideology could mean that in a couple of years we are paying \$800 pa to play hockey.

If you are not prepared to cop that then put your hand up to help raise funds, find sponsors, attract quality players and coaches etc.

My time at Macquarie has typically featured the odd good year in amongst some rotters. The period from 2001-2004 was one of constant growth in all aspects of the club and it has come as a disappointment to suffer a reversal just when we looked set to capitalise on recent success.

#### NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE 2004 ACCOUNTS

- (1) Consists of \$10,000 in registration funding and \$945 in management funding
- (2) MUSA went 50-50 with the club on uniforms up to \$3,000 each
- (3) \$6,000 for coaches in 2004, \$728 in late payment of 2003 coaches and \$182 for Level 1 courses in 2004
- (4) Included late payment of half the 2003 sponsorship.

#### Treasurer's Report

This, being my first year as MAGUTS treasurer, has been a massive learning curve for me. I started the year thinking my main duties were simply to collect fees which even that turned out to be more difficult than first thought. I must thank Ian greatly for all the help and guidance he has provided me.

Although last year was a huge success on and off the field, financially we ended substantially in the red after adding a fifth team.

This year a reduction in playing numbers and teams has reduced overall costs but without a sponsorship we will also likely return a loss.

We are over \$4,000 in credit with SHA ahead of their last bill which on past experience may be about that amount. Hopefully less than that.

Reducing our training time mid-way through the season to one night a week further cut overheads. Ideally, the committee would rather everyone turn up to both training sessions and we will start 2006 with 2 nights of training a week.

Unfortunately we weren't able to continue our sponsorship association with Epping Hotel and hence much of the committee's time was spent conjuring up ways to raise much needed funds. Most of the credit here must go to Club Captain Chris Jacka who did most of the organising for the first ever Macquarie University Men's Adventure race. We managed a small sum but the important thing is that the platform has been laid for more races in the future and gradually larger attendances.

I would also like to thank the coaches for their generous volunteer effort this year. As opposed to previous years, coaches from grades 2 down gave their time for gratis.

An impending fee rise next year will be discussed further by the committee although I'd like to remind everyone that our fees are currently still the lowest in Sydney. Even with a rise in fees we will still be amongst the cheapest in Sydney.

Then there are the issues of our own field being built which will secure our future even though VSU may 'unsecure' it. I'm not exactly sure how VSU is going to affect the club.

It has been a great experience being part of the committee and I appreciate the time and effort everyone has put in. Hope all MAGUTS have a safe a happy holidays and I look forward to seeing everyone fit and firing next year.

2006 will see the resurgence of the Mighty MAGUTS!

#### 1st Grade Report 2005 - Marcus Reed

With a new season of hockey dawning it was a time of renewing vigour and reclaiming fitness for the fight that was soon to break. But upon the clearing of fog, 6 members of the class of 2004 had gone missing whilst we greeted the return of Jacka II (Attack of the Clones) from his foray to the land of Tea and Scones.

The Watermelon made a return to the frontline after a season in self-imposed exile with 3<sup>rd</sup> grade during his guardianship of 1<sup>st</sup> grade. Along also came Ben H and a Bitch to claim their spots for a fulltime role in the big league. As did our biggest surprise packets; Jacka III (Revenge of the Sith) and Alex/Gibbo/Jesus/Funky Gibbon.

7 other sides made up Premier B, with the powers that be allotting three rounds and we were served up a fairly favourable draw. Yet still we ended up with a week's break before the first match (usually a bad omen), against the vile Ryde H-H.

True, we had lost some individual talent but damn had we become fast and quickly knit together. Although a 2-all draw, the game play itself was of a high quality which put hopes high as to how the rest of the year may unravel. Several members of the crowd were murmuring how it was the best game they'd seen the MAGUTS play in years.

Even a sub-par performance the following week, trouncing Sutherland 4-1, still showed patchy signs of that which would hound all teams this year. There on followed the big three that were always going to be trouble, yet I was confident of results at some point against them. Not in the first round, but signs certainly showed up. First up, Bankstown were at their usual annoying, super fit selves, but lessons had been learnt from our preseason drumming and limiting them to 2 goals a half was improvement enough, but lack of opportunities to score was disconcerting.

Along comes a weakened UNSW and the always formidable SWS. Very different teams, yet identical games with superb goalless first halves let down by three goals potted against in the second and too many missed opportunities by us in front of goal. Up next came Moorebank, who along with Sutherland had made their PB1 side their clubs 3<sup>rd</sup> grade squad. Utter MAGUT domination from start to finish for a 2-0 result that should have been more, which resulted in high praise from state coaches present.

A strong fightback to draw against Easts in a game that we should have won, followed by another quality tussle with Ryde for the same result. Then a bad 2-1 loss to Sutherland where again chances were spurned in front of goal. A solid physical encounter with Bankstown ended down 2-1 before two bad losses against UNSW and SWS with a combined total of 1 goal for to 10 against, rounded off with another dominating effort over Moorebank.

The final round started badly, concerning the table, yet the on field performances stepped up as a whole. Although results were not going our way the display of control of possession was quite something to behold, continuing to grow stronger. The games became much tighter, on field and on the scoreboard, except for an atrocious performance against Sutherland.

With some absolute dynamite performances against Ryde and UNSW (a pair of draws), and an unfortunate loss to Bankstown, this round was dominated by close matches, plus a much improved performance against South West Strikers, going down 3-1.

Our final standing of 7/8 was very disappointing considering the way we played.

Next year, with a better attendance rate, some focus can be given to set plays, converting chances and short corners – this should see the MAGUT first grade being a rather formidable team. Especially building off the back of the 3<sup>rd</sup> best defence in 2005, and so far set to lose only one player.

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Report

The year of 2005 will be a year that should have been for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. The season started on a positive note by gaining 6 points out of a possible 8 in our first four games. This came to a shuddering halt when the team came up with two shocking losses, conceding 12 goals. This stopped all momentum gained.

After the initial two games 2<sup>nd</sup> grade seemed to have dusted themselves off and began to replicate some of their early season and pre-season form. This once again stopped when Ian became sick and Gauci left the side. Players that were originally just part of the team had to step up into leadership positions. This, with a form slump, had the team in real trouble. But in true Magut colours the team kept turning up every week and putting in 100%. By the end of the second round of games the team was a new look side compared to the starting side at the beginning of the season. The final round of games had the second graders still in sight of making the play-offs. But with costly draws to Easts and Ryde and a loss to Sutherland really ended any aspirations of making the semis.

Although the team was in with a shot to make the semi finals, they really didn't deserve to make it. 2<sup>nd</sup> grade had the worst attendance record for the entirety of the season. This was another reason for the mid-season form slump. The worst training night was before the game against Sutherland that was a must win. No second grade player turned up. The only two were Marcus and Lenny who were coaching their respective sides.

2<sup>nd</sup> Grade for 2005 I believe learnt a valuable lesson. That is that they learnt to fight above their weight. For much of the season there was a reliance on 3<sup>rd</sup> grade players. I consistently had the maximum of five players per week, which meant that about a third of the team was backing up. This really put more reliance on the fresh players, which had an effect especially in the second half of games where teams were able to run around the defence. The best example of this was in the third game against South West Strikers. At half time we were down 1-0. By the end of the game it was approximately 8-0. The team played to the best of their ability but without a high level of fitness it showed and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade paid dearly for it against the better teams.

Therefore I think the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade of 2005 didn't perform to its potential. The side on its day could match it with the best sides in the competition. So I think that it should be put down to a rebuilding period after the large loss of players that was incurred after 2004. It is my belief that next year if the core of the side sticks together that they will certainly be playing in September.
